So, be sure to click on "Save and Keep Editing" to keep your work for future use. Also, most colleges offer foundation scholarships, so visit the website of the college you plan to attend.

Computer Instructions:

- 1. Go to https://southseattle.academicworks.com/
- 2. Click on "Sign Up."
- 3. You will need to provide an email address and create a password. Once you have completed this step, you will receive an email with a link that you will need to click on to activate your account.
- 4. When you have activated your account, fill in your Profile Information online.
- 5. Choose "South Seattle College Foundation Scholarship" for the last question.
- 6. Click on "Finish and Submit" (Note: If you made errors, you will return to the profile page to make corrections.).
- 7. Print a copy of your profile information page and your Foundation Scholarship application page. To make a copy, right click on your mouse and select "print".

Now you are ready to complete the **SSC Foundation Scholarship** application. Read the instructions on the "Frequently Asked Questions" tab carefully and check off each step as you complete it.

Remember:

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Activity 2.e Financial Plan Paragraph

Prerequisites: Activities 1.d, 2.a, 2.b, 2.c, and 2.d

Activity:

You will write ONE paragraph about your financial plan.

The purpose of this activity is to create a financial plan that will cover the total cost of your college education. The key to a good plan is that it be as detailed and specific as possible. Be sure to think about and include the following ideas in your paragraph:

- What is the total time commitment required for you to meet your educational goal?
- What is the total cost required for you to meet your educational goal?
- How do you plan to cover the cost of your education?
- Will you be able to work? How many hours?
- Who will you discuss this financial plan with?
- How will these people support you in reaching your educational goal?

Process:

- 1. Brainstorm your ideas.
- 2. Write one paragraph.
- 3. Check for a topic sentence, at least three supporting ideas and a concluding sentence.
- 4. Edit for grammar and spelling.
- 5. Peer-edit.
- 6. Type your paragraph.
- 7. Turn in your brainstorming and typed paragraph to your instructor for evaluation.
- 8. Retype your paragraph using your instructor's suggestions for improvement.
- 9. Save your paragraph on your flash drive.

10. Print a clean copy of your paragraph and put it in your Transition Portfolio behind this activity sheet.

Note: For independent learners, who are not enrolled in a class, skip steps #7 and #8.

Variations:

- Expand your paragraph to a multi-paragraph composition.
- Re-examine your plan and decide if it needs to be altered and, if so, in what ways.
