




Non-Credit ESL and Transitional ESL

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Non-Credit ESL

12 credit hours per week: Levels 1-5

Courses	Prerequisites	Description
Levels 1A, 1B, 2A, 2B, 3A, 3B and 4A	CASAS placement test or completion of previous level.	These are integrated core classes that focus on reading, writing, speaking and listening for work and life skills.
Levels 4B, 5A, 5B	CASAS placement test or completion of previous level.	These are integrated core classes that focus on reading, writing, speaking and listening for academic preparation. Students are encouraged to stay in non-credit ESL until they have completed level 5A, at least. Rushing into Transitional ESL is not a good idea. And it's expensive!

Transitional ESL I

15 credit hours per week: ESL 085, ESL 094 and ESL 095 (Concurrent Enrollment Required)

Course	Prerequisites	Description
ESL 085 Grammar	ESL COMPASS Combined Score: 218 (With a minimum of 74 in grammar and reading.)	This course covers basic English grammar with emphasis on sentence writing. Academic vocabulary is introduced.
ESL 094 Reading	ESL COMPASS Combined Score: 218 (With a minimum of 74 in grammar and reading.)	This course focuses on basic academic reading, vocabulary, and writing responses to readings.
ESL 095 Writing	ESL COMPASS Combined Score: 218 (With a minimum of 74 in grammar and reading.)	This course focuses on developing clear and coherent paragraphs.


Transitional ESL II

10 credit hours per week: ESL 086, ESL 096 and ESL 097 (Concurrent Enrollment Required)

Course	Prerequisites	Description
ESL 086 Grammar	ESL COMPASS Combined Score: 236 (with a minimum of 83 in grammar and reading). Or, completion of ESL 085.	This course covers intermediate/advanced grammar with emphasis on sentence and paragraph writing.
ESL 096 Reading	ESL COMPASS Combined Score: 236 (with a minimum of 83 in grammar and reading). Or, completion of ESL 094.	This course is designed to increase reading comprehension and speed, improve vocabulary and build academic confidence.
ESL 097 Writing	ESL COMPASS Combined Score: 236 (with a minimum of 83 in grammar and reading). Or, completion of ESL 095.	This course focuses on developing coherent paragraphs into short essays.






